WHY WAS HE KILLED ?

Tucapel Jimenez, President of ANEF, the Chilean public service workers' union, was on his way to a meeting when he was abducted by agents of the CNI, the secret police. He had called the meeting of different trade union groups in Chile to establish a united workers' front against the junta's monetarist policies.

He was found the next day, with bullets in his head and his throat cut. The judiciary set up an investigation, but one year later even the most obvious clues, which point to the CNI, have not been followed up. Clearly this was an official assassination with an official cover-up.

His death was a blow to the growing unity of the Chilean working class, but that unity has nevertheless grown impressively. Huge demonstrations, the biggest since the coup, have recently taken place in several cities in Chile, despite the continuing repression.

Their courage deserves your support. Join us on this picket on the anniversary of this murder.
