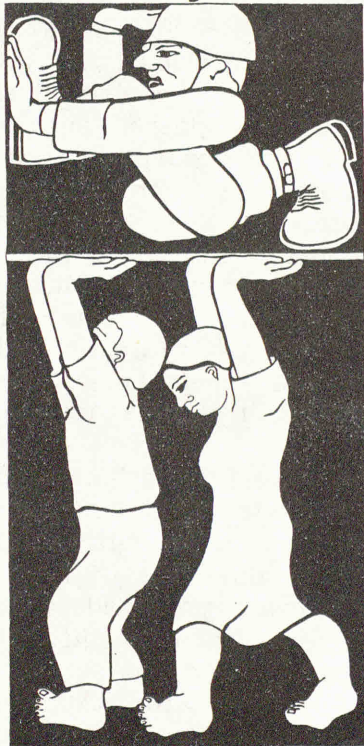

The most up to date documentary film on the situation in Chile, "Chile, I don't take your name in vain" is a stunning portrayal of how in 1983, after a decade's struggle for Human and Democratic Rights, the Chilean people lost their fear and gained the initiative from the military dictatorship of General Pinochet. The film covers the period from December 1982 to October 1983 giving particular emphasis to events since May 1983 when Days of National Protest began. Members of the human rights organisations, as well as trade unions the banned political parties, women's and shanty-town organisations, relatives of the Disappeared and grass roots Christian communities give their own account of how the Chilean Popular Movement has emerged in such a forceful way. The film also depicts the repression with which these initiatives have been met by the regime. Shanty town dwellers are interviewed about attacks made on their neighbourhood, last August, when Pinochet sent 18,000 troops onto the streets to put down the Fourth Day of National Protest, while another sequence symbolically shows how a funeral march for one of the many victims turns into a demonstration against the government.

Following a highly successful national film tour, the Chile Committee for Human Rights has now prepared a VIDEO of this much acclaimed new film, with English voice-over and subtitles. Profits from the hire of this video will go to the Cine Ojo Collective, who produced the film clandestinely in Chile and face great financial difficulties as they work on the second film in a projected series. Hire cost for non-profit making organisations is £10, (£20, if admission is charged), all other groups £35, with special rates subject to negotiation. The video must be accompanied by a member of the CCHR staff, who will be happy to address any meeting. Approximate running time 85mins.
