

Capri

Capri is a young woman singer who is coming directly from Chile for her first British performance. She was one of the leaders of the New Song Movement that took up the torch after the coup in September 1973. She founded the first artistic centre associated with opposition to the military regime, the <u>Casa Cultural Dona Javiera</u> and has been involved with many other foci of cultural resistance. A cassette of her music was recorded in 1982-3. She sings many of the cryptic songs of the underground which have had to find new forms of expression to avoid the censors and she has also helped to give prominence to lesser known singers and composers.

Earl Okin

Earl Okin is a multi-talented entertainer - singer, song writer, bossa nova and jazz guitarist and musical satirist. His songs have been recorded by stars as diverse as Cilla Black, Marian Montgomery and Cleo Laine. He has toured with Paul McCartney's Wings, Van Morrison, Jethro Tull and Ry Cooder, which gives some idea of his breadth of audience appeal. In 1984, he took part in the Edinburgh Fringe and was voted the best act in the whole of the Fringe.

Meliantu

The founder members of Meliantu met in prison in Chile soon after the coup and when they later arrived in Britain, they formed the band which has played in scores of solidarity events in the intervening years growing ever more polished and professional. This will be their first major appearance in London.
